Section 401 Certifications of 2017 Nationwide Permits

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Overview

Pursuant to 40 CFR 121.2 (a)(2) and (3), the State Water Control Board (the Board):

- examined the NWPs, the Norfolk District Regional Conditions, and
- ii. other decision documents provided by the Corps to base its certification.

The Board found that there is a reasonable assurance that the activities permitted under the Corps' NWP program, including the Norfolk District Regional Conditions, will be conducted in a manner which will not violate applicable water quality standards, provided permittees comply with all applicable Section 401 conditions.

 - Made in response to Corps' intent to allow use of NWP39 for non-SPGP projects

 - —Clarified existing procedures and processes to specify when compensation triggered

 - —Removed condition related to surface water withdrawals or associated structures, as activities precluded from coverage under these NWPs

- Reason for annual report from Corps to DEQ? (included in NWP #3 and #18):
 - Added in response to public comments requesting removal of condition associated with water withdrawals
 - We have very little direct data on the numbers/types of projects using NWP 3 and 18 for activities involving a water intake/water withdrawal.

• NWP #27

i. What is the process for DEQ monitoring plan approval?

Intent is for applicant to provide a monitoring plan appropriate for the restoration activity being permitted. DEQ process is intended to be simple email (approving) or request for additional monitoring plan elements during permit application review.

NWP #27 (cont.)

ii. What are the guidelines (when will these be provided)?

When restoration is occurring for other programs (i.e., SLAF, nutrient trading, etc.), DEQ will accept those programs' monitoring requirements, which, at a minimum, should include those elements listed in the 401 cert condition. We have observed many restoration projects proposed without any monitoring requirements. Most qualified practitioners are familiar with industry-accepted monitoring standards. 401 cert condition is intended to be the default guideline. Mitigation banks and ILF projects will just use (i.e., cite) the monitoring requirements in their operating Instruments.

NWP #27 (cont.)

iii. Duration of monitoring – how does this jive with the 2008 rule?

Intent is for applicant to provide a monitoring schedule appropriate for the restoration activity being permitted. DEQ process is intended to be simple email (approving) or request for modifications to the monitoring schedule.

NWP #39

i. Why was this unsuspended?

DEQ assumed (in it's tentative 401 cert notice) that this NWP would remain suspended due to SPGP. The Norfolk Corps determined that it should be unsuspended in case there was some project not qualifying for SPGP, but that would qualify for NWP39. DEQ made this change in the final 401 cert based on the Corps' comment.

ii. How does this affect Applicants?

Vast majority of commercial/institutional developments will use an SPGP. If there is a C/I development not qualifying for SPGP for some reason, then the Corps could permit with NWP39 instead of requiring an individual permit. This change should provide more flexibility to the Corps and regulated community.
